COME VISIT ALLENSWORTH STATE PARK:

Colonel Allensworth State Park is a very unique park in the California State Parks System. It is the only one of its kind. It preserves for us now and all future generations the positive contributions made by African Americans toward the development of the State of California.

The town was founded by an ex-slave and four other African Americans in 1908. The story of its rich history is provided by the volunteers from the Friends of Allensworth Interpretive Association (FOA) who sponsor these special events in cooperation with California State Parks.

Location - Colonel Allensworth SHP is north of Bakersfield; 20 miles north of Wasco on Highway 43; seven miles west of Earlimart on County Road J22.

Directions (South from L.A.)

From I-5 take 99 North; 30-miles past Bakersfield, EXIT and turn LEFT at CECIL AVENUE. Once on CECIL AVE., keep going west until road dead-ends. Turn RIGHT on CA HWY 43 go north into Tulare County for about 6-miles to PALMER AVENUE. Make left over the railroad tracks to the Park entrance.

THE RIDE: The Allensworth Funride & Century is a bike ride from Colonel Allensworth State Historic Park across the farmlands of California's San Joaquin Valley. Ride the beautiful foothills of the southern Sierra Nevada Mountains.



AFTER THE RIDE: The ride will conclude with a Buffalo Soldier style BBQ lunch, and centennial celebration festival of the founding of Allensworth at the town's center. There will be interesting exhibits, great food, good music, arts and crafts. You can also tour the towns square, narrated by Friends of Allensworth docents

RIDE DESCRIPTIONS

BUFFALO SOLDIERS FUN RIDE (40 miles) – This ALL FLAT route takes cyclists across the San Joaquin Valley via historic Garces Hwy 155. From the first rest stop in the orange groves cyclists will turn around and head back to the town of Allensworth. Most of this route is flat. Riders will still experience some beautiful ranchlands at the base of the foothills. This route is for **BEGINNERS**

THE FIREHOUSE (80 miles) – This route takes cyclists across the agricultural flatlands of the San Joaquin Valley via historic Garces Hwy to the settlement town of Woody. From the Firehouse and Historic settlement cabin, cyclists will turn around and descend back down Garces Hwy to McFarland, CA. From there the riders will head back to Allensworth. This is an up and back ride. Half of this route is flat, riders will still experience a gradual climb to some beautiful ranchlands at the base of the foothills. This route is for **BEGINNER / INTERMEDIATE RIDERS**

WOODY ROAD WESTERN TRAIL (90 + miles) - This quiet route will take cyclists across the valley via Garces Hwy to Woody. After a brief rest stop, it's southbound across the countryside's rolling hills of longhorn, sheep, horses and squirrels, through the prairie lands via Woody Rd. towards Tule Road. There will be a stop at in McFarland, CA. From there riders will head northwest through the city of Delano to the town of Allensworth. This route is for **INTERMEDIATE RIDERS - ROLLING HILLS**

GRANITE WALL (100+ miles) - This route will take cyclists across the agricultural flatlands of the San Joaquin Valley via historic Garces Hwy. Through the settlement town of Woody, cyclists will continue their climb up through the mountains toward Glennville, to Granite Road. Cyclists will descend southbound back through gorgeous hillside rancheros of Woody via to Tule Road. There will be a stop in McFarland township at Browning Community Park. Riders will head back through the city of Delano northwest to the town of Allensworth. Riders will experience some of the most beautiful frontier countryside in the southern Sierras. Due to changes in elevation, weather, and traffic this route is **RECOMMENDED FOR ADVANCED OR EXPERIENCED RIDERS**
